Hallo Graham. I'm contacting you from BBC's daytime programme, <u>Money for Nothing</u> (it's a 'live' link so just click on it for more - Ed). I'm not sure if you're familiar with the show but the premise is that we take reclaimed pieces of furniture and interiors and we have wonderful artisans who redesign them into a brand new piece. We currently have a beautiful hand made stained glass room divider, which was made by Bruce Kenneth in Scissett, Yorkshire. I came across the British Glass Foundation and thought it might be of interest to your readership.

We have a pair of lounge doors with original bubble glass, having been cut down to smaller pieces and paired with stunning pieces of stained glass. These have been creatively lead-lighted together to create a contemporary room divider. The glass sections have then been placed with a new frame. The asking price is £875.00 ono.

For whoever purchases this we will film a short sales sequence at your location featuring the item in its new home. Our sale sequences typically consist of an exterior shot of the location that has purchased an item, general views of the inside of the location (including pan shots), shots of the item in its new home and a short interview with the person who has purchased the item to tell us why they bought it, what attracted them to it and so forth. In the final programme we will either name the business and location in voice-over or we will show a sign with the business' name.
